# DIOCESE OF WIAKATO AND TARANAKI STATISTICS FOR THE FIRST DIOCESAN CONVERSATION

# INTRODUCTION

The first Diocesan Conversation is aimed at providing a full picture of the current state of the diocese. Part of this is providing statistics on the diocese. For the sake of the conversation, statistics over the last 30 years are provided in increments of 5 years. The first set is parish statistics that were gathered from the yearly schedules completed by parishes after their AGMs. Not all parishes submitted returns. The percentage after the year relates to the returns received back from parishes. Since 2010 the percentage of returns has decreased significantly. The figures have been extrapolated using this percentage to better compare the years.

The second set is financial statistics from the Standing Committee financial reports.


## PARISH STATISTICS


The following statistics from parish schedules are included below: Total attendance for the year; Baptism (including infant, school age and adult); Weddings and Funerals.






This is graphically expressed below. The orange line is an exponential trend line based on the extrapolated figures.

2020 was significantly impacted by Covid which makes it an outlier in the bigger picture and hard to include in a meaningful way.


Apart from attendance, all the other statistics follow a similar pattern. There is a significant decline between 1990 and 1995. From 1995 to 2010 it remains relatively stable. Between 2010 and 2015 there is a significant reduction again. From 2015 to 2023 there are slight increases in most of the data.


Attendance followed a different pattern. It was fairly stable until 2010 with a significant reduction between 2010 and 2015. Since 2015 it has remained stable.


### FINANCIAL STATISTICS

The financial statistics come from the financial statements of Standing Committee. It mostly represents the administration cost of running the diocese. Below are figures and graphs representing the income, expense and surplus/deficit of each year. The budget for 2024 is included to help understand the current trend.
