Lay Practicum Module 1 - Anglican Identity (part one):

Essential for *Lay Practicum Programme* members. Other people are welcome to join, see “can attend” in table above.

The Anglican Christian tradition has its roots in the early Anglo Celtic missions and grew out of the ancient faith of the English-speaking peoples. It has DNA from the Mediterranean apostolic mission of the first century. This hybrid heritage became independent of the Roman Catholic Church at the time of the reformation but retained a Catholic heart together with a reforming mind. The heritage has since found roots and wings in many cultures and parts of the world, and is now the world's third largest church. These sessions will explore the vital signs of the heritage and its life and the characteristics of its mission over time.
